To meet our aim, we will interview individuals representing four stakeholder groups: public citizens; healthcare leaders; academics and researchers; and decision makers, including individuals involved in professional industries that might influence healthcare. By gathering insight into the similarities and differences in their perceptions and experiences, we will be able to get a well-rounded idea of what can be done to improve the current system, and how to go about doing this.
