For the first part of the application process you will submit an EOI that will be evaluated by a work integrated learning practitioner from Management Career Services. For the EOI we are seeking to understand your motivation to complete an EWT, how it relates to your academic program, the skills you seek to develop and how an EWT will help you with your intended career development goals. While students are required to complete a work integrated learning component within the majority of the programs we offer, the ability to participate in an EWT must be approved through a specific and thorough process to ensure there is both rigor to the learning that the student will receive and that there is appropriate support for the student in the EWT experience itself.

Venture Description
