




Figure 9. Migrants to, within and from Europe, 1990–2020

### **EUROPE NET MIGRATION FLOWS 1970-2020**




### NET MIGRATION RATE BY COUNTRY (2015-2020)


### EU EXTERNAL BORDERS: SOME STATISTICS

- Official crossing points at the external EU borders => 1,792 (665 air, 871 sea, 246 land)
- Persons entering the EU => 878 million
- Refused entries => over 300,000
- Illegal immigrants in the EU =>
   c. 8 million (80% in Schengen area)



Illegal immigrants apprehended => 500,000

#### **EU MIGRATION POLICY – OVERVIEW (1)**

 Migration as key component of EU "Justice Freedom and Security" domain

One of most recent areas of EU activity (since '90s)

Type of migration

 → regular/irregular
 → long/short term



#### **EU MIGRATION POLICY – OVERVIEW (2)**

- Target groups
- → EU citizens; 3<sup>rd</sup> country residents; 3<sup>rd</sup> country nationals
- Competence:
   EU <u>and</u> members states
- EU competence => rules on:
  - visas



 immigration of highly skilled workers, researchers, students, seasonal workers, intra-firm employees

**MSs = > ultimately decide who enter** 



#### THE SCHENGEN REGIME -BACKGROUND

• Goals:

1) abolition of checks at internal borders of signatory states

2) creation of a single external frontier

 Foundations => 1985 and 1990 Schengen agreements (from 1999 part of EU law)

• Entry into force => March 1995

# SCHENGEN AND THE EU EXTERNAL FRONTIERS

- Common management of external frontiers => requires harmonization of rules and procedures
- Harmonized rules => defined in 1990 Schengen Convention and in a Common Manual
- EU Agency responsible for external frontiers => FRONTEX




# SCHENGEN'S 'COMPENSATORY MEASURES'

- Abolition of checks at internal borders => accompanied by so-called 'compensatory measures'
- Compensatory measures include:
  - police cooperation
     customs cooperation
     judicial cooperation
  - 4) a common visa regime



#### **THE SCHENGEN VISA LISTS**



EU member states

Special visa-free provisions (e.g. overseas territories)

Visa-free access to the Schengen states for 90 days

Visa required to enter the Schengen states

- => implementation of Schengen acquis
- => upgrading border checks with non-Schengen states
- Progress reports => Schengen Evaluation Group
- Romania and Bulgaria:
- => EU members since 2007
- => Schengen membership delayed

# EU backs Italy in stand-off with NGOs over refugee rescue


