





and hesitant Europe. Clancy's Vorodin wants to restore the old Soviet empire and thereby amass enormous wealth with his henchmen in the Kremlin.











CASSANDRA's fields of interest






The Conflict and Emotion Map is intended to show which texts, ideas, feelings and narratives are circulating in a region. In this way, social and political upheavals become visible at an early stage - long before troop movements

and explosions.

Recognize connections, patterns and emotional trends - The 'Conflict and Emotion Map' as a visualization tool






Boualem Sansal (*1949) is an Algerian author.

His dystopian novel, "2084" (2015) was inspired by George Orwell's Nineteen-Eighty Four and is set in an Islamist totalitarian world.



In December 2012, Azerbaijani writer Akram Aylisli published his novel "Stone Dreams," which focused on the 1989-90 anti-Armenian pogroms in Baku and the massacres committed by Turkish troops against the Armenians of his home village in 1918. As a result, he went overnight from being a celebrated national writer to an enemy of the state, accused of having "betrayed" his nation.









CASSANDRA meets Ulysses

As soon as the potential danger has been recognized and localized in advance by "Cassandra", the work of "Ulysses" begins.

The special focus is on the timely isolation and neutralization of extremists and hardliners (e.g. by undermining their propaganda) as well as structural measures (e.g. reducing social tensions).

The earlier Cassandra locates threats, the more efficiently Odysseus' survival strategies can be implemented. In this respect, CASSANDRA and ULYSSES belong integrally together.
