



## JEAN MONNET EUROPEAN UNION CENTRE OF EXCELLENCE ESSAY COMPETITION

The Jean Monnet European Union Centre of Excellence (JMEUCE) at Dalhousie University is funded in part by the European Union (EU) to study comparative policies pertaining to the EU and Canada, EU-Canada relations and EU policies more generally. This year's award is supported with residual funds from the Jean Monnet Chair in Border Control.

**The Centre offers an annual award of \$200 for the best student essay on any aspect of the EU. Students are encouraged to examine topics that deal with individual member states or the European Union as a whole.**

### Eligibility

The JMEUCE Essay Competition is open to all registered full-time or part-time (minimum of three courses) Dalhousie University students who are presently enrolled in a graduate programme or undergraduate study.

### Application and deadline

Candidates should submit a digital copy of their essay to [jmeuce@dal.ca](mailto:jmeuce@dal.ca) together with a brief written endorsement from the relevant course lecturer. Both must be received by **5.00 pm on 30<sup>th</sup> April**. If your essay is in pdf, please provide a second copy without your name to facilitate unbiased reviewing by the selection committee.
