*HOW TO SUBMIT YOUR OFFICIAL GRADES

Applicants from Nova Scotia or Ontario who have a provincial student ID number should submit it to the Registrar's Office. We will then be able to download your official grades electronically. If you didn't provide this number on your admissions application, you can email it to admissions@dal.ca.

All other students should have their high school submit your grades via official transcript. Visit our <u>website</u> to learn what makes a transcript official and how to send it to us. If you sent an official first semester transcript as part of your admissions application, you do not need to send another copy for your entrance award application. If your school is not semestered, have your high school submit your most recent official mid-term grades.
