- Applicants from Ontario High Schools applying through the Ontario Universities' Application Centre should submit their OUAC number to allow their grades to be sent to Dalhousie electronically. If received after applying, please forward your OUAC number by email to: admissions@dal.ca.
- Applicants from Nova Scotia public high schools who provide their provincial student number will have their grades sent to Dalhousie electronically.
