Pesticide Continuing Education Points Program seminar leaders

Extended Learning (EL) is seeking subject matter experts to lead day long Pesticide Applicator Continuing Education seminars for both agriculture and landscape pesticide applicators. The seminar follows the Nova Scotia Environment Pesticide Continuing Education Points Program.

The purpose of Nova Scotia Environment's (NSE) Pesticide Continuing Education Points (CEP) Program is to create safe, knowledgeable, and professional pesticide applicators and vendors. This program promotes continued learning and skill development to ensure the safe and effective application of pesticides. The CEP Program enables some applicators and vendors to renew their certification through continued education rather than completing an exam. (https://novascotia.ca/nse/pests/cep-program.asp)

The seminar is targeted to licensed pesticide applicators in the areas of agriculture and landscape. Licensed pesticide applicators are required to accumulate 15 CEPs over a five-year period through approved training sessions such as this.

Interested parties should have expertise in one or more of the following areas:

- 1. General information
- 2. Regulations
- 3. Labelling
- 4. Human Health
- 5. Environment
- 6. Pesticide Safety
- 7. Pest Management
- 8. Application Technology
- 9. Emergency Response
- 10. Professionalism

Sample topics could include:

- Calculations and calibration procedures
- Application and calibration techniques with landscape equipment
- Resistance
- New product registrations
- Stewardship
- Diagnosis

Instructor requirements:

- 3-5 years' experience in the areas of pesticide use and integrated pest management
- Demonstrated knowledge product registrations and legislation
- Experience teaching a small group

Instructor roles and responsibilities 1,2

- Prepare seminar outlines, lectures and activities for in-class sessions
- Demonstrate competency in technology required to deliver course material
- Work within an agreed-upon schedule
- Ensure that training is delivered in a safe manner
- Be accountable for personal tasks and responsibilities as assigned
- Provide recommendations on training facilities and resources
- Ensure the best interests of learners, EL, and the Faculty are met
