#### **COURSE SELECTION GUIDANCE:**

- Your Writing Requirement courses (one per term) must be in a single subject.
- Select a combination of three Humanities and Social Sciences courses in the Fall term, and three more in the Winter term. We recommend that you take a selection of both Humanities and Social Science courses to help you meet your General Degree Requirements for the BA.
- **Explore other interests** by taking two **Elective** courses (one each term), which may be chosen from any Subject Group (Humanities, Social Sciences, Languages, or Sciences), or even from among eligible courses offered by other Faculties at Dalhousie or The University of King's College. You are encouraged to select Electives that will broaden your educational experience and satisfy your interests.
- In the Fall term, you are encouraged—but not required—to select a First-Year Interest Group (FIG). The FIGs groups are led by senior students and are non-credit. FIGs offers new students the opportunity to build important skills, connect with other students and learn tips for success.

### **Definitions and Additional Information**

## **General Degree Requirements**

The FASS Worksheet has been designed to provide you with a suitable grounding for study in the Faculty, and to complete in your first year most of the foundational General Degree Requirements for the BA degree. Any unfulfilled requirements simply need to be completed by the end of your degree—it is **NOT** necessary to complete all General Degree Requirements in the first year.

The General Degree Requirements are as follows:

- Writing Requirement - 6 credit hours, same subject
- 2. Subject Area Requirements
  - a. Humanities - 6 credit hours b. Social Sciences - 6 credit hours
  - c. Sciences - 6 credit hours
- 3. Language Requirement 6 credit hours, same language

Students may find that one General Degree Requirement remains incomplete at the end of their first year—typically, either 2c) the Science Requirement or 3) the Language Requirement, depending on their choice of Elective. The Faculty recommends that most students choose a Language as their Elective, thus delaying completion of the Science requirement until second year or later. If you choose a Science course as your Writing Requirement course, then all General Degree Requirements could be completed in first year. However, we strongly urge you to choose your Writing Requirement courses from a subject area that is in or close to the academic discipline in which you expect to pursue a Major.

# 1. Writing Requirement

The writing requirement must be satisfied by taking 6 credit hours in a single subject.

The courses that you choose to fulfill this requirement will also serve to fulfill a **Subject Area** Requirement (see above: General Degree Requirements). For example, ENGL 1005.03 + ENGL 1100.03 will fulfill both the Writing Requirement and the Humanities Requirement, or HIST 1510.06 will fulfill both the Writing Requirement and the Social Sciences Requirement, or OCEA 1001.03 + OCEA 1002.03, or SUST 1000.06, will fulfill both the Writing Requirement and the Science Requirement.

## 3. Language Requirement

Students may choose language courses as Electives or as Humanities courses. Completing six credit-hours (typically two courses, one each term) in a <u>single</u> language will fulfill the Language Requirement.

Choose your **Language Requirement** from among the following options:

**Arabic:** ARBC 1021.03 + ARBC 1022.03 **Chinese:** CHIN 1031.03 + CHIN 1032.03

Latin CLAS 2401.03 + CLAS 2402.03 (listed under 'Classics')

Ancient Greek: CLAS 2505.03 + CLAS 2506.03 (listed under 'Classics')

French: Six credit hours in any courses taught in French; but typically,

FREN 1007.03 + FREN 1008.03, or

FREN 1047.03 + FREN 1048.03 (Intermediate), or

FREN 1057.03 + FREN 1058.03 (for Former Immersion Students)

 German:
 GERM 1003.03 + GERM 1004.03

 Italian:
 ITAL 1000.03 + ITAL 1001.03

 Russian:
 RUSN 1002.03 + RUSN 1003.03

**Spanish:** SPAN 1021.03 + SPAN 1022.03; or SPAN 1035XY.06

**NOTE:** BA students who choose to major in economics, philosophy, political science, psychology or sociology and social anthropology may substitute for a language course at least six credit hours in mathematics or statistics taught by the Department of Mathematics and Statistics, other than MATH 1001.03, MATH 1002.03, MATH 1003.03, MATH 1110.03, MATH 1120.03, or MATH 1115.03, to meet this requirement; or they may meet it by passing the test administered by the Department of Math and Stats.

#### **Electives**

The Faculty recommends that you select <u>either</u> <u>Language Requirement</u> courses <u>or</u> <u>Science</u> <u>Requirement</u> courses as your Electives in your first year. If you are interested in Majoring in a language (or languages), you should choose <u>Language</u> Requirement courses as your Electives.

Students are permitted to enroll in elective courses offered by Faculties at Dalhousie University other than the Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences including courses from the Faculties of Science, Computer Science, and Agriculture, as well as the College of Sustainability.

Access to courses in the Faculties of Architecture, Health, Law, Management, or Engineering is possible, but limited by the rules and regulations of these Faculties, and these "Outside Electives" are also limited in number to a maximum of 18 credit-hours in the BA degree. Consult the prerequisites and restrictions that may apply to any course listed in the Academic Timetable to determine admissibility or talk to an Advisor.

#### First Year Interest Groups (FIGs) - Arts

A First-Year Interest Group, or FIG, is a great opportunity to meet other first-year students with similar interests or goals. These non-credit courses are led by senior students, and groups will meet once a week during the fall term to explore interests, build connections, and learn tips for success!
