***PERF 1000.03** and **PERF 1002.03** satisfies both the Writing Course and Humanities requirements of the General Degree Requirements.

****Note: Theatre Studies** students are required to take 6-credit hours of a 1000-level Theatre (THEA) course at some point in their degree. Students should consider taking one of the first-year practical theatre courses such as THEA 1051.03 **and** THEA 1052.03 (Technical), THEA 1451.03 **and** THEA 1452.03 (Costume Studies), or THEA 1801.03 **and** THEA 1802.03 (Acting); or may wish to take an elective in their first year.

Every BA student must complete the [General Degree Requirements](#) before graduation. Many students choose to complete these in their first year, but this is not required; however, we *strongly recommend* completion of both the **Writing Requirement** and the **Language Requirement** in first year. To complete any of the [Subject Group Requirements](#), you may take either 6 credit hours in a single subject, or 3 credit hours in two different subjects.

LANGUAGE REQUIREMENT COURSE:

Select a Language Course and record it in the Course Selection Box. To satisfy the language requirement, **you must take six credit hours in a single subject** some time before you graduate. Students considering a study-abroad opportunity later in the degree should begin any relevant language study in first year.

- **Arabic:** ARBC 1021.03 **and** ARBC 1022.03
- **Chinese (Mandarin):** CHIN 1031.03 **&** CHIN 1032.03
- **Ancient Greek (under Classics):** CLAS 2505.03 **and** CLAS 2506.03
- **Latin (under Classics):** CLAS 2401 **&** CLAS 2402
- **French:** 6-credit hours in any courses taught in French, typically; FREN 1007.03 + FREN 1008.03, or FREN 1047.03 + FREN 1048.03 (intermediate), or FREN 1057.03 + FREN 1058.03 (for Former Immersion Students)
- **German:** GERM 1003.03 **and** GERM 1004.03
- **Italian:** ITAL 1000.03 **and** ITAL 1001.03
- **Russian:** RUSN 1002.03 **and** RUSN 1003.03
- **Spanish:** SPAN 1021.03 **and** SPAN 1022.03; **or** SPAN1035.06

SUBJECT GROUP REQUIREMENTS

Between now and graduation, you must select 6 credit hours from each of the three Subject Groupings – Social Sciences, Humanities, and Science. You are encouraged to begin fulfilling these Subject Groupings in your first year, but consider your intended major, interests, and strengths when selecting your first-year courses. If, for example, you anticipate difficulties in completing the Science requirement simultaneously with the Language requirement, we recommend that you delay completion of the Science requirement until a subsequent year.
