*** **IPHE 4900:** Register for this like you would a course but when the semester begins, you will not actually attend a lecture each Tuesday/Thursday as noted in the timetable. Do not be concerned with any time conflicts that show between IPHE 4900 and other courses. More details on IPHE will be provided to students early in the fall semester.

**** **Open Elective:** This can be any course of your choice for which you are permitted to register. Students should look through many subject areas in the academic timetable to try to find a 1000 level course in a subject area of interest.

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
