

APPLICATION GUIDELINES FOR EXCHANGE STUDENTS

If you are a graduate student planning to take graduate classes at Dalhousie, you must fill out a graduate application form. The following is for undergraduate studies only.

Your completed application form should be sent to the International Centre as per the instructions on our website (www.dal.ca/ises).

If you have any questions, please feel free to contact the International Centre at international.centre@dal.ca.

Start Date & Personal Details

Please select the year and term when you intend to study at Dalhousie.

If you are coming to Dalhousie for a full academic year (September to April), please check **both** the Fall and Winter boxes. This is very important! Please note that if this section is not completed correctly you may experience delays in the processing of your Course Selection form.

Your date of birth should appear in this order: day (two digits), month (two digits), and year (four digits). For example, if you were born on April 10, 1989, you should write: 10.04.1989.

Only Canadian or American citizens have Social Insurance or Social Security numbers (SIN/SSN). It is not mandatory to provide this information.

International students should check the box "Study Permit." For more information on study permits, please visit our website at www.dal.ca/ises.

Secondary Study (High School)

Please tell us what high school you attended, where it is located, and when you graduated (month [two digits] and year [four digits]).

All other questions in this section are not required.

Official transcripts from your high school are **not** required.

Post-Secondary Study (College/University)

In this section, you are required to provide details about studies you've undertaken after graduating from high school. In the Degree/Diploma column, please indicate the level of study (e.g. Bachelor's degree) and the field of your studies (e.g. English, Management, Computer Science, etc.).

You must also attach all official transcripts from post-secondary institutions.

You do not need to complete the "English Language Proficiency" and "Agent Representation" sections.

Program Selection

You are not required to complete this section, as it only applies to degree-seeking students.

Major or Field of Study / Additional Information

Please indicate your Major or field of study at your home university under "Exchange Students/Visiting Students." All other questions in this section are not required.
