

Dear Dalhousie Student,

Thank you for your interest in a university-wide exchange or study abroad program!

The International Centre (IC) encourages Dalhousie students to integrate an international academic experience into their degree through established linkages with a variety of universities overseas. Students wishing to be considered for any of the university-wide programs (including the Bader International Study Centre at Herstmonceux Castle) are required to submit the attached application form. If you have been nominated (in February) to study at a partner institution, you will be given the appropriate application for that specific university at a later date.

At this time, we would like to remind you that there are certain risks inherent in participating in international academic activities, and that international study is not appropriate for every student. You are encouraged to familiarize yourself with general and specific risks associated with travelling to the region(s) that interest you. Travel reports issued by the Department of Foreign Affairs and International Trade should be read for more information at: http://www.travel.gc.ca/.

Please note that the selection process for Dalhousie University's university-wide exchange programs is competitive. Not all applicants will receive a nomination to their first-choice institution. However, if you meet our eligibility criteria, and you are <u>flexible about where you spend your term or year abroad</u>, we will do our best to place you at one of our partner universities.

It is important that you conduct research about the universities which interest you. This research may be done online (www.dal.ca/international), in the IC Resource Library, by attending an Information Session, participating in a region-specific session, and by meeting with the Study Abroad & Exchange Advisor to discuss your top three university choices. We also encourage you to read Country Reports (available at the IC) submitted by previous Dalhousie exchange students, and to meet with former exchange students to learn about their experiences.

A number of factors should be considered when determining which institution might be the best match for you. These include:

- * Academic program match
- * Interest in courses available at that university
- * Health and safety concerns
- * Interest in the country or city

- * Size of the institution or city
- * Affordability/cost of living
- * Commitments in Canada prior to leaving or upon return

I would like to remind you that participating in an international program will involve a significant amount of responsibility on your part. If nominated for one of our programs, you will be provided with direction and guidance by our department. However, you need to be prepared to take care of logistics independently. These include, but are not limited to: obtaining/renewing your passport, applying for any required study permits/visas, researching health and travel insurance options, booking your travels, arranging your accommodations, meeting with your academic advisor, and obtaining a Letter of Permission.

Do not leave any section blank. For help with completing the application, please email exchanges@dal.ca. Incomplete applications will not be reviewed.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT COMPLETING THE APPLICATION FORM

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

Students must meet the following eligibility criteria in order to be considered for a University-Wide Exchange or Study Abroad program:

- Be in an undergraduate or graduate program at Dalhousie University;
- Be in good academic standing with a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or above (undergraduate students);
 Please note:
 - A GPA of 2.5 is the minimum required in order to be considered. Some partner universities require applicants to have a higher GPA. <u>It is the responsibility of the student to</u> ensure s/he meets these prior to applying,
- Have completed 4 full academic credit courses at Dalhousie University;
- Be eligible to register at Dalhousie for the period of the international experience.

ADDITIONAL APPLICATION INFORMATION

Academic Information (Section 3)

Please discuss plans to spend a term/year abroad with your departmental advisor to confirm that you will meet your Dalhousie program requirements. If you have not yet declared a major, please meet with an academic advisor to do so prior to completing the application.

Exchange/Study Abroad Information (Section 5)

Be sure you are familiar with the correct term/semester dates of the partner university, and that you select the correct corresponding Dalhousie term(s) for which you intend to be away. Summer programs are not available at all partner institutions, and, if they are, it may be on a study abroad (fee paying) basis. Not all partner universities will be available for full-year exchange programs.

Proposed Course Selection (Section 6)

The number of courses you list should be equal to a full-time course load <u>at the host institution</u>. Different universities have different full-time course loads: understanding what constitutes a full course load at the host institution is part of your research. After you have been nominated to a specific university, you will be required to finalize your course selection, and to complete a Letter of Permission. Instructions about this will be provided <u>after</u> the selection process is complete.

Cost of Living Worksheet (Section 7)

This worksheet will help you understand the potential financial requirements of a term abroad. The international offices at the partner institutions typically provide approximate costs of living on their websites. Students applying for exchange partner universities will pay their tuition (15 credit hours) directly to Dalhousie, where students applying to study abroad partner universities (with the exception of the International Study Centre, Herstmonceux Castle, St. Andrews where program fees are paid through Dalhousie University) will typically pay their tuition directly to the host university (in the local currency).

Cover Letter (Section 8)

Please write a cover letter, explaining the reasons why you would like to participate in an exchange/study abroad program. This letter should also illustrate how the courses you have proposed (first choice institution only) will complement your Dalhousie degree. You are encouraged to demonstrate that you have researched the potential host city and country.

Letter of Reference Form (Attachment)

This form must be completed by a Dalhousie University professor or instructor who is familiar with your academic work. This is a required component of the application.

Interviews and Selection

If you meet the minimum eligibility requirements, you will be invited to an Exchange/Study Abroad Interview. The Selection Committee will determine how serious you are about integrating an international experience into your degree, as well as your personal and academic fit with the program.

Following the interviews, students who have been selected as exchange/study abroad nominees will be asked to complete the partner university application, and to participate in Pre-Departure meetings and sessions. Attendance is required at these sessions.

Reference Form

A professor must complete the Letter of Reference Form. It is important to not leave this until the last minute, it does take time for professors to fill out these types of forms and you want to make sure you will have it in time for the application due date.

We understand that early in your academic career you may not know all your professors on a close, personal basis. If this is the case you can always make an appointment with a professor and bring in an essay or lab you completed to remind them of your work. Explain your desire to go on exchange and your motivations for doing so.

If you feel that a TA or lab instructor may know you better than the professor, you can always suggest that the professor to talk to them. Alternatively, the TA might be willing to write a brief letter about you to assist the professor. This would provide your professor with more insight into your academic preparedness.

This letter of reference is very basic: Don't lose sleep over it! Note that the reference does not receive a score, but does help the nominating committee. Everyone has to submit an academic reference.
