Course Description

The fundamental theory and principles of surface science are introduced. Topics include the atomic structure of solid surfaces, thermodynamic and kinetic properties of surfaces, electronic and bonding behavior of surfaces, catalytic processes by surfaces, and typical surface analysis techniques.

CHEM 2301& 2304, or PHYC 3200&3640, or equivalent. Minimum grades: C-

Course Objectives/Learning Outcomes

This class will cover some fundamentally important topics on surface chemistry and physics. It will provide students with the opportunity to integrate knowledge learned in previous physical chemistry (or chemical physics) classes and apply it to various technically important systems where the surfaces are essential in controlling their overall properties and performance.
