

Dental hygiene professionals play a primary role in health promotion and preventive oral health care.

### **BACHELOR OF DENTAL HYGIENE**

The Bachelor of Dental Hygiene (BDH) program combines a minimum of 30 credit hours of university course work with two years in the dental hygiene program. The two-year professional, evidence-based Bachelor of Dental Hygiene (BDH) program is taught in a positive and learner-centred environment.

Most classes, research, and clinical work take place in the Dentistry Building, while medical science courses may be taught elsewhere on campus. The BDH program also offers interprofessional education (IPE) opportunities with other health professions.

The program is fully accredited and has a reputation for excellence in dental hygiene education in a way that balances knowledge and skills.

# **Pre-clinical experience**

First-year BDH students learn basic skills in a state-of-the-art simulation laboratory.

### **Clinical experience**

BDH students treat 8-10 patients each in the dental clinic during the second and third terms of their first year in the program.

Second-year BDH students treat 40-60 patients in collaboration with fourth-year dentistry students in the clinic's small group practice.



### **Rotations and outreach clinics**

BDH students benefit from rotations in orthodontic, paediatric, and oral maxillofacial clinics.

Throughout their studies, BDH students are introduced to community health concepts and program planning. Outreach placements include:

- the Camp Hill Veterans Memorial Building at the QEII Health Sciences Centre
- elementary schools in the Halifax area
- the North End Community Health Centre (NECHC) dental clinic
- the Government Assisted Populations (GAP) Clinic

### **Admission requirements**

Admission to the two-year BDH program requires the completion of at least 30 credit hours of university study, including, but not limited to:

- · at least 3 credit hours in introductory chemistry
- at least 6 credit hours in introductory biology
- at least 6 credit hours in an approved writing course
- at least 3 credit hours in human anatomy
- at least 6 credit hours in human physiology
- · 6 additional credit hours

These courses must be completed by May 1 of the year of expected entry to the School of Dental Hygiene.

Up to 34 students are accepted each year. The applicant pool varies from year to year. Most applicants who are accepted have an average of B+ (75-79) or better in their most recent university courses. Applicants with the best academic record have the greatest chance of being accepted for admission.

# BACHELOR OF DENTAL HYGIENE WITH HONOURS

The School of Dental Hygiene also offers a Bachelor of Dental Hygiene with Honours [BDH(Hons)], which is a one-year full-time or two-year part-time degree completion program. It consists of 30 credit hours or five full credit equivalents (10 half credits) and is focused on four areas: teaching, research, health policy, and health promotion.

### **Admission requirements**

The admission requirements for the BDH(Hons) program are:

- completion of a minimum of 30 credit hours of university study, plus completion of a 60-credit hour Diploma in Dental Hygiene from an accredited program in Canada or the United States; OR completion of a Bachelor of Dental Hygiene from an accredited program in Canada or the United States
- · eligibility for licence to practise dental hygiene in Nova Scotia

A minimum of 45 credit hours of programming outlined above, including the 30-credit hour BDH(Hons), must be completed at Dalhousie University.

# **OUR COMMITMENT TO DIVERSITY**

The School of Dental Hygiene is committed to increasing the number of qualified dental hygienists who come from the African Nova Scotia or Indigenous populations of the Atlantic region. Applicants from these groups who have completed the entrance requirements by May 1 of the year of expected entry, have achieved a B average or better in a full course load in their most recent year of university study, and have acceptable scores on all other admission criteria, will be admitted to the BDH program.

### **APPLICATION DATES**

The dental hygiene application form must be submitted to the Dalhousie University Office of the Registrar by **February 15**. Final university transcripts must be submitted by **May 30** of the planned year of entry.

The following supporting documentation must be submitted as part of an application:

- · application form and fee
- · official transcripts

# FAST FACTS ABOUT OUR BDH PROGRAM:

- Faculty-to-student ratio: 1:34 in classroom settings;
   1:7 in preclinical settings;
   1:6 in clinical settings
- 100% passing rate on the National Dental Hygiene Certification Examination (NDHCE)
- Graduate employment rate: 100% within 6 months of successful completion of the NDHCE
- Dental hygienists earn an average of \$39-\$58 per hour in Canada

Application packages must be complete to be considered by the admissions committee.

Upon notice of acceptance to the School of Dental Hygiene, applicants must submit the sum of \$1,000 to the Office of the Registrar. This amount is credited toward tuition fees if the student registers in the program, but it is not refundable if she/he withdraws.

# **MORE INFORMATION**

There is a strong demand for dental hygienists in the workforce. New graduates can expect a starting salary of \$35+ per hour in a private dental practice in Nova Scotia.

# Academic Requirement\* (Prerequisite courses\* for admissions):

Applicants must have completed before May 1 of the year of expected entry to the diploma in dental hygiene program, at least 30 credit hours of study at an accredited university. These credit hours should include:
