

ORAL AND MAXILLOFACIAL SURGERY

The Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery Graduate Training Program is committed to providing the necessary education and training to produce graduating professionals capable of the highest clinical and scholarly pursuits.

PROGRAM OF STUDY

The program is of six years' duration. It is a joint program leading to an MD/MSc in Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery. The program utilizes the facilities of the Queen Elizabeth II Health Sciences Centre, IWK—Grace Health Care Centre and Dalhousie University. Extensive training is provided in surgical correction of dentofacial deformities, obstructive sleep apnea, cleft lip and palate, maxillofacial pathology and reconstruction, maxillofacial trauma, dental implants and other surgery as it pertains to the specialty. An important part of the program is devoted to research, including an original research project leading to a Master's thesis and defence.

Qualification for the program requires that you be eligible for student licensure in Nova Scotia as approved by the Provincial Dental Board of Nova Scotia.

The program, while formally based in the Faculty of Graduate Studies, is substantially based in the Faculties of Dentistry and Medicine.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Candidates must possess a DDS or DMD and be eligible for student licensure in the Province of Nova Scotia.

Candidates must register for the entire six years of the program.

Application must be completed prior to August 31st of the year preceding commencement of the program. **It is the responsibility of the applicant to ensure that all documentation has been received by the Department of Oral and Maxillofacial Sciences by the August 31st deadline.**
