## **Hazards Identified:**

Heavy lifting, slippery conditions, poor lifting techniques, over exertion, over reaching, concealed objects, blood borne pathogens, overfilled trash containers,

## **Personal Protective Equipment Required:**

Safe footwear, safety gloves

## **Training Required:**

**Proper Lifting Techniques** 

These safe work practices must be followed at all times and are to be reviewed annually.

- 1. Only properly trained employees are to perform this task.
- 2. The required PPE must be worn at all times.
- 3. Only use heavy duty / industrial "weight" garbage bags.
- 4. Always assume that a bag of garbage is going to be heavy to lift.
- 5. Test the load before lifting and prepare for the lift accordingly.
- 6. Use smaller size garbage containers and bags to reduce the weight to be lifted.

- 7. Install false bottoms in garbage containers to reduce their capacity.
- 8. Tie off bags when they are half full, to control the amount of waste placed in a bag, and place another bag on top of the tied off bag.
- 9. Consider the time of year / level of campus activity when assessing how much waste may be in a garbage container.
- 10. Keep the area around garbage containers clean and free from debris, particularly slippery items or sharp objects.
- 11. Use a dust pan and broom to clean up any debris, broken glass or other objects that have spilled out of the bag and on to the floor.
- 12. Test the load before removing a garbage bag from its container.
- 13. Do not reach into the bag to remove items with your bare hands.
- 14. Do a visual assessment of the bag contents for obvious sharp objects.
- 15. Empty garbage containers as frequently as possible to avoid over filling of bags / containers.
- 16. Gather the top of the bag and use the ends to tie it together.
- 17. When lifting a garbage bag from its container listen for the rattle of broken glass or the scraping of sharp objects on the side of the barrel.
- 18. Avoid serious cuts by not letting bags brush against your legs.
- 19. When carrying a garbage bag support it close to but not touching your body.
- 20. Get help with heavy loads.
- 21. Bend at the knees to pick-up and replace smaller waste containers.
- 22. Do not repeatedly bend at the waste.
- 23. Support container on a waist high surface to empty container and replace bag.
- 24. DO NOT support the weight of a garbage bag by putting a hand under the bag.
- 25. Do not attempt to compress the bag contents.

- 26. Always wear heavy rubber gloves when collecting garbage.
- 27. Empty garbage containers frequently during busy periods of the year so they don't get to full.
- 28. Dispose of the garbage in the designated dumpster or garbage holding area.
- 29. Avoid the suction effect between the bag and sides of the containers by drilling holes in the bottom of the container.
- 30. If you must drag a garbage bag always check the floor areas where the bag was dragged.
- 31. Clean up any liquids that leak from garbage bags immediately.
- 32. Use a trolley to transport a number of bags at a time in order to reduce the distance you must carry a full garbage bag and the number of trips you must make.
- 33. Place dumpsters close to loading docks for ease of access.
- 34. Place a platform in front of dumpsters to make it easier to left garbage into the dumpster.
