What Did We Do?

On November 23, 2011, ACEWH introduced our new Sex- and Gender-Based **Analysis** (SGBA) e-Learning Resource: Rising to the Challenge (SGBA-resource.ca). Those who braved the winter storm were treated to one of the first looks at the website. The event was hosted at the Public Archives of Nova Scotia in Halifax in partnership with our collaborators, the British Columbia Centre of Excellence for Women's Health and Prairie Women's Health Centre of Excellence.

What Was Discussed?

Barbara Clow, ACEWH's Executive Director, began the event with a brief history of the SGBA e-Learning Resource and provided an overview of the website. Jennifer Bernier, Researcher and Project Coordinator, then lead the audience through an interactive demonstration of the website and online curriculum, including an in-depth look at one of the tutorials. Participants were given the opportunity to ask questions about the website, its contents, and receive further assistance navigating the site.

As part of the event, Andrea Papan, Researcher, showcased another project ACEWH has supported, The Source/La Source, a Pan-Canadian webbased resource of women's health data sources, reports and synthesis documents. Source/La Source can be found at womenshealthdata.ca.

What is SGBA-resource.ca?

The SGBA e-Learning Resource is the first online curriculum of its kind, allowing health planners, policy-makers, researchers, students and practitioners in Canada and abroad to learn about sex- and gender-based analysis at their own pace at work or at home. Based on the book, Rising to the Challenge: Sex- and Gender-Based Analysis for Health Planning, Policy and Research in Canada (available both at the SGBA website and acewh.dal.ca), the site features a series of free tutorials that allow users to explore the core concepts (sex, gender, diversity and equity) and the process (issues, populations, evidence, implications and recommendations) of SGBA.

Whether you are new to sexand gender-based analysis or have advanced knowledge in the area, SGBA-resource.ca deepen your understanding of the core concepts and process of SGBA, provide you with a wealth of information and many opportunities to practice SGBA, and make it easier for you to integrate SGBA into your own work.

The website is available in both English and French.
