

# The Academic Refresher Series

This series of courses is designed to refresh the key academic skills, math skills and English language skills needed for academic success. If a student has been academically dismissed, with approval from a faculty advisor, they can return to their studies sooner if they are successful in one or more courses in this series.

## A NEW APPROACH TO ACHIEVING ACADEMIC SUCCESS

Each of these three, 36-hour courses is offered online and incorporates a multimodal approach to teaching and learning. Each course is six weeks long and has a workload of six hours per week (four hours of asynchronous self-paced work and two hours of synchronous live sessions). The tuition fee is \$600 (CAD) per course.

This course is designed to help students understand the nature of university learning and academic expectations. Students will learn how to build a solid foundation for academic success and increase self-awareness by exploring their learning styles, motivation and study habits. Topics will include time management, reading, note-taking, critical thinking, academic writing, and preparing for exams.

## **Optional Course #1**

### **MATH REFRESHER**

This course is based on Grade 12 pre-calculus math curriculum tailored to the needs of students, following a diagnostic test that students would take in advance.



The Math Refresher course is right for students if they have experienced challenges with any of the following math concepts:

- Performing algebraic equations
- Interpreting and performing operations with functions and relations
- Linear and quadratic functions
- Polynomial and rational functions
- Exponential and logarithmic functions
- Right angle trigonometry and trigonometric functions
- Analytic trigonometry and/or the basic concepts in limits, derivatives, and integrals of functions

## ***Optional Course #2***

### **ENGLISH LANGUAGE REFRESHER**

This course is for students who are currently enrolled in a degree program and have been academically dismissed, and are looking to improve their English language skills.

Students will get training in writing assignments, understanding course materials including readings and lectures, and giving academic presentations. It will also provide students an opportunity to practice the English language from their discipline-specific perspective.

The English Language Refresher is right for students if they have experienced challenges with any of the following:

- Confidence in using English in class discussions
- Understanding and responding to professors
- Understanding information in class lectures
- Understanding and using information from course readings
- Presenting or writing assignments in English
- Using discipline-specific language in spoken and written assignments
