

Dear Dalhousie Student,

Thank you for your interest in a departmental exchange program with the University of Newcastle-upon-Tyne!

Dalhousie students are encouraged to integrate an international academic experience into their degree through established linkages with a variety of universities overseas. Students wishing to be considered for any of the university-wide programs (including the International Study Centre at Herstmonceux Castle) are required to submit an application to the International Student and Exchange Services (ISES). Students wishing to be considered for the departmental exchange with the University of Newcastle are required to submit an application to the English department.

At this time, we would like to remind you that there are certain risks inherent in participating in international academic activities, and that international study is not appropriate for every student. You are encouraged to familiarize yourself with general and specific risks associated with travelling to the region(s) that interest you. Travel reports issued by the Department of Foreign Affairs and International Trade should be read for more information at: http://www.voyage.gc.ca/.

Please note that the selection process for Dalhousie University's university-wide and departmental exchange programs is competitive. Not all applicants will receive a nomination.

A number of factors should be considered whether an exchange is right for you. These include:

- \* Academic program match
- \* Interest in courses available at Newcastle
- \* Health and safety concerns
- \* Interest in the country or city

- \* Size of the institution or city
- \* Affordability/cost of living
- \* Commitments in Canada prior to leaving or upon return

I would like to remind you that participating in an international program will involve a significant amount of responsibility on your part. If nominated, you will be provided with direction and guidance by our department. However, you need to be prepared to take care of logistics independently. These include, but are not limited to: obtaining/renewing your passport, applying for any required study permits/visas, researching health and travel insurance options, booking your travels, arranging your accommodations, meeting with your academic advisor, and obtaining a Letter of Permission.

Finally, carefully complete the application <u>legibly</u> and in <u>pen</u>. Do not leave any section blank. <u>Incomplete</u> applications will not be reviewed.

# IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT COMPLETING THE APPLICATION FORM

## ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

Students must meet the following eligibility criteria in order to be considered for an English Department Exchange:

- Be in an undergraduate program at Dalhousie University;
- Be in good academic standing with a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or above
- Have completed 5 full academic credit courses at Dalhousie University;
- Be returning to Dalhousie University for at least one term following the Exchange/Study Abroad term/year;
- Be eligible to register at Dalhousie for the period of his/her international experience.

### ADDITIONAL APPLICATION INFORMATION

#### Academic Information

Please discuss plans to spend a term/year abroad with an academic advisor to confirm that you will meet your Dalhousie program requirements. If you have not yet declared a major, or have indicated a major that is not reflected on your academic record, please contact the Registrar's Office to update your record.

### Exchange/Study Abroad Information

Be sure you are familiar with the correct term/semester dates of the partner university, and that you select the correct corresponding Dalhousie term(s) for which you intend to be away.

### Proposed Course Selection

The number of courses you list should be equal to a full-time course load <u>at the host institution</u>. Different universities have different full-time course loads: understanding what constitutes a full course load at the host institution is part of your research. After you have been nominated to Newcastle, you will be required to finalize your course selection, and to complete a Letter of Permission. Instructions about this will be provided <u>after</u> the selection process is complete.

### Cost of Living Worksheet

This worksheet will help you understand the potential financial requirements of a term abroad. The international offices at Newcastle provides approximate costs of living on their websites. Students will pay their tuition (15 credit hours) directly to Dalhousie.

#### Statement of Interest

Please write a 200 - 250 word statement, explaining the reasons why you would like to participate in this exchange program. This statement should also illustrate how the courses you have proposed will complement your Dalhousie degree. You are encouraged to demonstrate that you have researched the host city and country.

#### Letter of Reference Form (Attachment)

This form must be completed by a Dalhousie University professor or instructor who is familiar with your academic work. This is a required component of the application.

#### Interviews and Selection

If you meet the minimum eligibility requirements, you will be invited to an Exchange Interview. The Selection Committee will determine how serious you are about integrating an international experience into your degree, as well as your personal and academic fit with the program.

Following the interviews, students who have been selected as exchange nominees will be asked to complete the partner university application, and to participate in Pre-Departure meetings and sessions with ISES. Attendance is required at these sessions.
