The courses will be offered annually following the same schedule, and learners will have three years to complete the certificate after their first enrollment.* Each course has the previous one as a pre-requisite, but learners can be admitted without prerequisites with the permission of the instructor or through a Recognition of Prior Learning assessment by the Faculty of Open Learning & Career Development.

* Note: While the certificate has a three-year time limit for completion, it is designed to take learners through the entire assessment cycle and finish with a complete plan. As such, the instructors encourage learners to take all five courses consecutively in a single cycle.
