Position Title : Occupational Therapy Mentor (Disability-Informed / Lived Experience)

Job Summary & Key Responsibilities

The Dalhousie School of Occupational Therapy (OT) is seeking applications from qualified candidates for a 2-year term as an occupational therapy mentor who self-identifies with disability to join our team of experienced mentors. The Dalhousie School of OT mentor program began in 2022 and provides confidential support to OT students who identify as Indigenous, 2SLGBTQ+, African Nova Scotian or other racialized groups, and/or disabled.

This is a dynamic role that requires flexibility to adapt to the changing needs of students in the Entry Level Occupational Therapy Program. Minimum expectations of the role include:

- Connect with interested students (one-on-one, and/or in groups, virtual and/or in person) to provide support, connection, advice and encouragement
- As needed, guide students to navigate barriers, hostility, discrimination, exclusion, isolation in the program/in the profession
- Provide support to students who identify with disability, and/or have lived experience with conditions categorized as 'disability' (e.g., physical, neurological, cognitive, sensory, mental health, neurodivergence)
- Help students strategize around accommodations processes
- When possible, attend class sessions and/or orientation sessions where instructors have allowed time to meet with students, typically once per term
- Help students identify resources that may be useful, at the School, University and/or in the profession
- Meet (usually virtually) regularly with other mentors and Chair of the Equity Committee, typically once per term, to check in and plan events as needed
- Work collaboratively and learn alongside mentors, School of OT Equity Committee and students to improve the educational experience of students from equity-denied groups.

Required Qualifications:

- Registered occupational therapist in one of the Atlantic Canadian Provinces (NS, NB, PEI, NL)
- Self-identify with disability and/or one of the categories included under that label at universities (e.g., chronic health issues, neurodivergence, learning differences)

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Preferred Qualifications:

- Preference will be given to a candidate who can attend occasional in-person events at Dalhousie in Halifax; however, this position can be completed virtually. We encourage applications from interested applicants from all Atlantic provinces
- Experience with mentoring preferred but not required.
- Having faced barriers during OT education considered an asset!

Time commitments

- Estimated 5 hours per month or less

Compensation

- \$52.96 /hour

Additional Information

- All qualified candidates are encouraged to apply; however Canadians and permanent residents will be given priority.
