## **WORK ASSIGNMENT**

Key responsibilities will be:

- Provide on-line course assistance with the Course Instructor to prepare and manage content through the Brightspace platform e.g., setting up, organizing, and monitoring the components of the course
- Respond to student queries about coursework in collaboration with course instructor
- Monitoring and/or assessment of on-line lab submissions/discussion boards
- Collaborate with instructor on student evaluation- including grading assignments (online and inclass) and development of test questions and review questions
- Development of teaching and learning activities related to course-specific topic in collaboration
  with course instructor and in alignment with experience/expertise (e.g., opportunity for miniguest lecturing or creation of short videos that supplement course material)
- Follow up with students as necessary
- Attend orientation sessions prior to the academic term (to be scheduled with the course instructor) and meet with course instructor during classes as needed
- Other duties may be required to assist with course delivery

Note that this is a partly condensed course running twice a week from Sept 2 to Sept 25<sup>th</sup> and then once a week until the end of October. Some marking on weekends or evenings may be required during condensed period.

## **REQUIREMENTS OF POSITION:**

Candidates must hold a graduate degree in OT. Prior teaching experience (online or in-person), excellent communication and organizational skills an asset. Familiarity with, and enthusiasm for, occupational therapy models/frames of references, assessments and critical perspectives an asset.
