Dal is Moving to the Entry-Level PharmD



n January 2013, the application to move to an entry-topractice Doctor of Pharmacy by the University of Toronto and University of Waterloo was approved. The University of Montreal and Laval University have been offering the PharmD program for a number of years already. As a result of these events, by 2016/17 over 50% of all pharmacy students graduating in Canada will receive a PharmD degree. Dalhousie and all the remaining pharmacy schools are in the planning stages of changing over to the undergraduate PharmD. One of the major changes in the program includes an increase in the number of structured practical experiences from 20 weeks to 40 weeks. In order to accommodate the additional practical experience, several of the biomedical and chemistry courses will be moved to prerequisites, changing the total program to a 2+4 program as opposed to the current 1+4.

This transition will take considerable work and time to ensure the continued excellence of our program. Tentatively, we are targeting September 2016 for the intake of the first PharmD class. Stay tuned for further communications as well as opportunities to be involved in this exciting time in the history of the College of Pharmacy.

Director's Message



It is hard to believe that this will be my last Director's Message. I will be retiring at the end

of June after over fifteen years at the College of Pharmacy. To think when I arrived in September 1998, it was only for a one year period. The time has flown by and our team at the College has accomplished so much:

- The College's unique Problem-Based Learning Curriculum is fully accredited (three times now) and is recognized for academic excellence both nationally and internationally.
- Our graduate program, the Masters of Sciences in Pharmaceutical Sciences, was reintroduced in 2010.
- Our enrolment increased from 66 to 90 students and funds were raised to build a new multi-skills laboratory, enlarge our classrooms and build seminar rooms.
- One of the biggest changes over the years has been the expanding role of the pharmacist. I feel fortunate to have been part of these changes and see this expanded scope be incorporated in our curriculum.

We have given our graduates the skills and tools to practice in this new environment. I am excited to watch our graduates move the profession forward.

n September 2013, we lost an important colleague from the pharmacy world. Karen Zed graduated from the College of Pharmacy in 1974 and practiced community pharmacy in Halifax for almost her entire career. She had been a fixture in the south end as the pharmacy manager of Lawtons Drugs, Halifax Professional Centre, for the past 23 years. Prior to Lawtons, she could be found at O'Brien's Pharmacy a few streets away on Coburg Road.



Her proximity to the university meant that pharmacy students were

never in short supply and she pushed them to be strong contributors to the profession. Karen was a committed supporter of the Dalhousie College of Pharmacy's Practice Experience Programs (PEP). She was an excellent preceptor, mentor, and teacher who always provided any extra support she could give. Her passion for teaching extended to the more recent influx of international pharmacists. She was patient and nurturing, allowing them to adapt their styles and lessons from their home countries. The Nova Scotia College of Pharmacists never hesitated to lean on her to evaluate new entrants and approve their structured time service.

Karen graciously volunteered her time and supported pharmacy development and education on numerous committees. She was recognized in 2003 as the College of Pharmacy's Alumnus of the Year. She was dedicated to her patients and highly respected by her colleagues for her commitment to patient care.

Relaunch of the Drug Information Resources (DIR) Website

ver faced with a drug information question that your "go-to" reference can't answer? The Drug Information Resources (DIR) website is a web portal that brings together resources within 64 categories including specific disease states, adverse drug reactions, compounding, drug interactions, and much more. Within each category you can find links to websites, journal articles and texts on that particular subject.

Dr. Mary MacCara and Elizabeth Foy created the DIR website to help pharmacists connect with credible drug information resources. The website first went online in 1996, and thanks to funding from the Dalhousie Pharmacy Endowment Fund to employ a pharmacy student, the site is regularly updated to meet the needs of the changing scope of pharmacy practice. Over the last year, the website received close to 6000 hits per month and was used by pharmacists and students in over 150 countries worldwide.

We are excited to announce the arrival of an updated DIR website! The website has a new, easy-to-navigate layout and new pages including one on immunization which brings together recommended references for pharmacists. The page includes standards of practice, background information on vaccines and how to properly handle and store vaccines. The site also has a new "Dal Access" page that brings together common clinical resources (general monographic, evidence based medicine, drug interactions, natural health products, drugs in pregnancy and lactation, risk assessment tools, etc.) including those for which Dalhousie University has a subscription. These resources are available to students, faculty and others affiliated with Dalhousie University.
