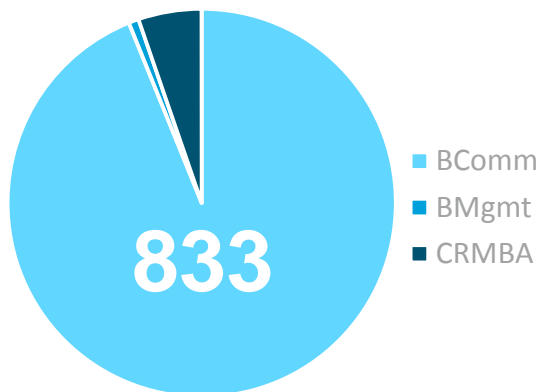

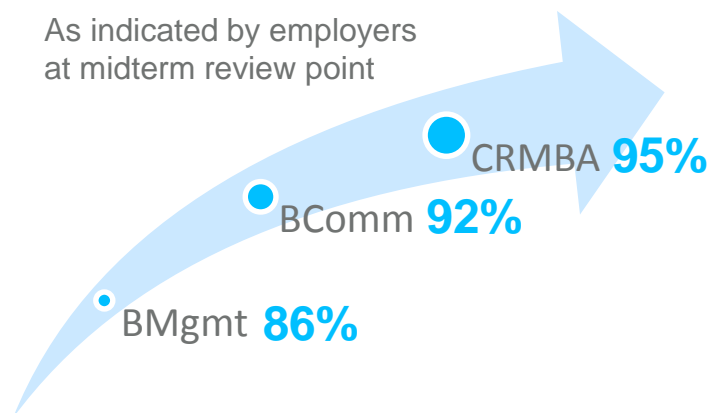

## COMPLETED WORK TERMS

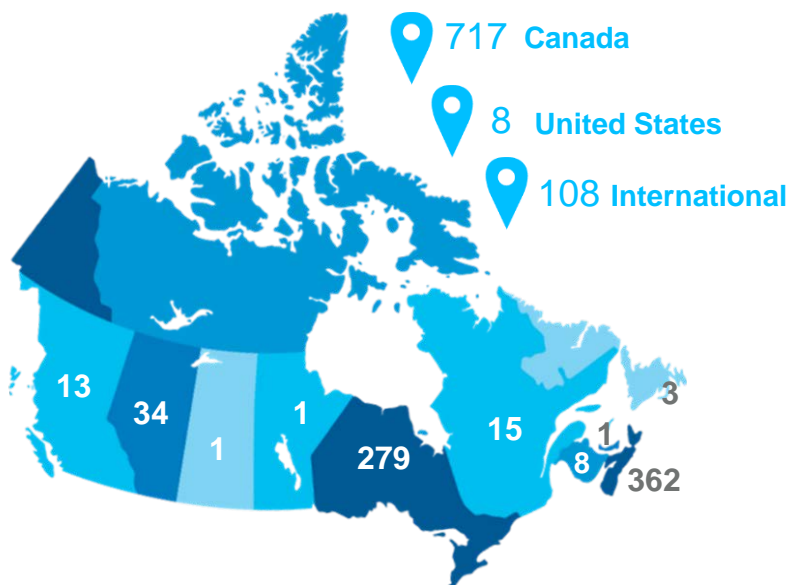


## STUDENTS EVALUATED AS VERY GOOD OR BETTER

As indicated by employers at midterm review point



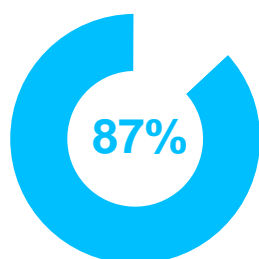
## WORK TERM LOCATIONS



## COLLECTIVE STUDENT EARNING (Canadian Work Terms)

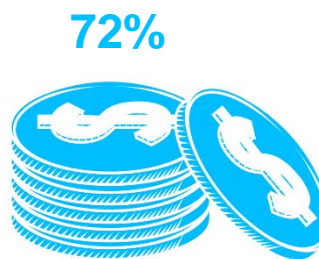


## EMPLOYED WITHIN 6 MONTHS\*



2017 grads who responded to the survey and were actively seeking employment.

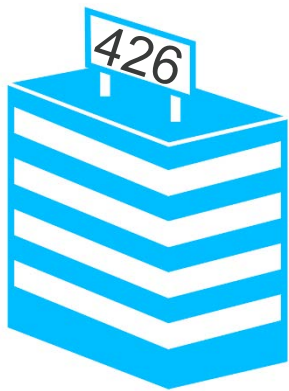
## EARNING 40K OR MORE\*
