- **Transport:** Movement of products from one location to another.
- **Warehousing:** Ensures the smooth flow of goods and materials through the supply chain from supplier to customer.
- **Distribution:** Movement of goods to consumers.
- **Customer Service:** Understanding and anticipating customer requirements, addressing their concerns, exceeding expectations, etc. to ensure a commitment to delivering high-quality products or services in a timely manner.

Supply chain management is viewed different from one business to another and usually carries out multiple functions as mentioned above. It is not uncommon for some organizations to only focus on one specific area, such as logistics, distribution, or warehousing, and provide these services as a third party for other companies.
