General Update

On 1 July 2020, Dr. Paul Atkinson became Dalhousie Medicine New Brunswick's new Assistant Dean of Research, succeeding Dr. Anthony Reiman who inaugurated the position and helped build the now thriving research enterprise at DMNB over the past 11 years.

"I'm looking forward to an opportunity – for myself, for Dalhousie Medicine New Brunswick, and for researchers in New Brunswick – to consolidate the great work that has been done so far and look to new horizons, new opportunities, and new directions," says Dr. Atkinson of his new role. "I think Dalhousie Medicine New Brunswick is still a very young institution and we're at an early stage in our growth in research, so it's an exciting time to be able to come in and hopefully shape something that will last into the future."

The DMNB Assistant Dean of Research Office is currently in the process of establishing a DMNB Research Council to help support research under the four pillars of 1) Biomedical Science and Laboratory Research; 2) Health Services Research; 3) Clinical Research; and 4) Medical Education Research

In other exciting news this quarter, a new postdoctoral fellow, Dr. Sundaram Pakkiriswami, joined Dr. Thomas Pulinilkunnil's Laboratory on October 1, 2020.

Additionally, Dr. Dan Dutton was featured on CBC regional radio and in a written story in July related to his NBIF project: "Researcher wants to know if New Brunswickers are slipping back into pre-COVID ways."

Funding Awarded to Principal Investigators (PIs)

In the July to September 2020 quarter, Dr. Petra Kienesberger received a \$10,164 allocation from Canada Research Continuity Emergency Fund (CRCEF), which was awarded through UNB.

Dr. Dan Dutton received \$47,500 through the NBIF COVID Research Fund as the principal applicant on a project entitled "Assessing the impact of COVID-19 on alcohol consumption and related harms among New Brunswick adults."

Dr. Paul Atkinson brought in \$9,000 from the SJRH Foundation for COVID research as well as an impressive \$2.5 million CIHR award for the National Emergency Medicine COVID Registry in which he is the New Brunswick lead Co-Principal Investigator.

- 1. I co-presented a workshop at last year's North Amercian IPE conference (Collaborating Across Borders VII) on delivering IPE activities via distance learning. This is a Dalhousie IPE collaboration, with DMNB, Nursing, Social Work, Faculty of Health, and Nursing faculty from Yarmouth. We are in the process of submitting a manuscript to the Journal of Interprofessional Education & Practice entitled: "IPE via Online Education: Pedagogical Pathways Spanning the Distance". We just received word that it has been accepted, with minor revisions suggested.

We had an interesting research project lined up for an IPE SIM activity that would have happened in March, but it was cancelled. We were going to look at pre-SIM anxiety using a 'test anxiety inventory' (TAI) measure. We have REB approval from this past winter, so we plan to still do the study, hopefully, next winter.
