Course: Creating a Healthy Learning Environment

September 20 – November 1, 2022

Objectives:

By the time they have completed the course, participants will be able to:

1. Describe the learning environment and how faculty can positively influence it.
2. Be able to demonstrate how the learning environment is linked to student and faculty wellness.
3. Develop approaches to supporting student wellness.
4. Explain what is meant by student mistreatment, how it occurs and what can be done about it in relation to its impact on the learning environment.

Units:

1. Understanding the learning environment.
2. Student mistreatment in the clinical learning environment.
3. Supporting students from racialized groups.
4. Wellness, duty hours, and work-life integration.

Delivery details:

This course will be delivered using a blended model with core content provided in an online, asynchronous fashion comprising assigned readings, videos, and discussion boards moderated by experienced medical educators. The course will also offer interactive, facilitated teaching and drop-in sessions presented by content experts and skilled facilitators.
