

Medical Records Keeping Course

Everything we do in healthcare involves some degree of communication, be it visual, verbal or written. Communicating effectively involves ensuring the proper and complete transfer of information to another.

In the practice of medicine, the provision of appropriate care necessitates the seamless and flawless flow of this information to ensure continuous, collaborative care. Unfortunately, all too often, this flow of information is not adequate or contains error which disrupts proper patient care.

This course was developed in response to an identified need to have a local (content and geographical) course on Medical Record keeping. In response to this need, and with the support of the College of Physicians and Surgeons Nova Scotia (CPSNS), we developed an online, 24/7 accessible course on medical record keeping that can be accessed from wherever and revisited to reinforce learning and practice.

COURSE OUTLINE: Comprising nine units, the course content includes a curated mixture of articles, websites and videos which is tested via exercises (quizzes, reflections, assignments). Feedback is provided by course instructor(s). At the start and end of course, a self assessment survey on 6 chart reviews of the participant's choosing is required. The final assignment is a commitment to change exercise.
