Building connections with colleagues is crucial to maintain both interest and momentum, especially for those new to medical education scholarship. Yet, many of us don't have the regular opportunities and support to thoughtfully engage in conversation around our scholarly pursuits. Recognizing this, CPDME is launching two initiatives in 2022.
