We are pleased to announce that the next academic detailing topic will be ready for detailing in April.

The topic is “**Type 2 Diabetes: SGLT-2 Inhibitors and GLP-1 Agonists**”. We have collaborated with specialists in Internal Medicine in preparation for this topic.

The objectives are to review evidence evaluating *clinical efficacy and harm outcomes* of SGLT-2 inhibitors and GLP-1 agonists in the treatment of Type 2 Diabetes (T2DM).

You will have an opportunity to discuss the following questions:

1. What is the evidence for benefit of SGLT-2 inhibitors for macrovascular and microvascular outcomes in the treatment of T2DM?
2. What is the evidence for benefit of GLP-1 agonists for macrovascular and microvascular outcomes in the treatment of T2DM?
3. What are the potential harms associated with SGLT-2 inhibitors in the treatment of T2DM?
4. What are the potential harms associated with GLP-1 agonists in the treatment of T2DM?
5. How do the Diabetes Canada guideline recommendations align with the evidence?
