Part Two: Narrative Report

This section is your opportunity to write about your experience more thoroughly. It is an opportunity to reflect on your professional and personal learning and development; the highlights, the lowlights, shifting expectations, and unique insights. It will be an invaluable piece of information for students preparing for an education experience, for sponsors who are interested in funding such experiences further, and for the Global Health Office as part of our knowledge base on global health education. The narrative report should be 3-5 pages and include the following information:

1. Your Name, Program, Year of Study, Country, and Title of your Education Experience on the cover page.
2. Given what you now know, what would you have liked to have done to better prepare for the trip?
3. How could the GHO have supported you better?
4. Reflections on your professional learning objectives.
5. What clinical skills and knowledge did you gain during your education experience?
6. Reflections on your personal learning objectives.

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7. What opportunities and what challenges (both ethical and practical) did you encounter during your time abroad?
8. How do you feel this experience will benefit and/or impact upon your educational and/or professional career path?
9. How did this experience influence or change your previous understandings of global health?
10. What do you miss most about the host country (people, places, situations)?
11. What do you miss least about being abroad (people, places, situations)?
12. What bothers you most about being home?
13. How did you cope with re-entry and reverse culture shock?
14. How did your perspective on life change?
