Grand Challenges Canada have recently announced Round 3 of their funding program designed to encourage Integrated Innovations for Global Mental Health. The program seeks innovative solutions for improving treatment and expanding access to mental health care in low- and middle-income countries. Applicants must propose innovative solutions to one (or more) of the following specific challenges:

- Integrated screening and core packages of services into routine primary health care
- Reduce the cost and improve the supply of effective medications
- Provide effective and affordable community-based care and rehabilitation
- Improve children's access to evidence-based care and rehabilitation

- Develop effective treatments for use by non-specialists, including lay health workers with minimal training
- Incorporate functional impairment and disability into assessment
- Develop mobile and IT technologies (such as telemedicine) to increase access to evidence-based care
