Upon entering the Tanzania Summer Program 2013 my understanding of global health was idealistic, not realizing the strife and hardships people often go through to not only obtain health care, but to cope in their own communities. I was unaware of the stigma attached to AIDS, and how debilitating it can be. In a country where AIDS is so prevalent, it is hard to imagine students being ostracized by their teachers, and adults shunned in their own communities. I saw firsthand how cultures and beliefs could affect patient outcomes.
