

In-Course Scholarships & Awards – Brief Terms

Annual application open to all Med 2 – Med 4 learners through MEDIX. Eligibility Criteria varies per award. Applications close early October.

Note: a completed application includes all supporting documentation.

Award descriptions

A Joseph H. Lesser, MD Memorial Scholarship

Awarded to students who demonstrate a high academic standing and are in the top 20% of the class.

Esther Strung Memorial Scholarship

Awarded to a student entering the third or fourth year of the program of studies leading to the Doctor of Medicine degree (MD).

Dr. Anne Hamilton Scholarship

Awarded to a second-year medical student who has achieved a high standard of academic excellence.

Dr. Mabel E. Goudge Scholarship

Awarded to the woman student in each class with the highest standing in their class.

Professor John Cameron Prize in Anatomy

Awarded to the student in first year with the highest mark in Anatomy.

Dr. Harry Poulus Prize

Awarded to the second-year student in the Faculty of Medicine who has the highest standing in Psychiatry.

Roberta Bond Nichols Memorial Award

Awarded to the woman medical student having the highest standing in Anatomy.

Dr. J.V. Graham Award

Awarded to a student at the end of second year who has attained high standing in the first-and-second-year anatomy course.

Harold Barnett Prize

Awarded to the student who has attained the highest standing within the topics of Metabolism and/or Physiology.

Dr. Forest W. Fyfe Scholarship

Awarded to a student entering the second year of studies who has achieved an excellent standard of performance in first-year Anatomy curriculum.

James A. Phills, M.D. Memorial Scholarship

A scholarship based on demonstrated financial need and high academic merit to benefit a student from an under-represented community.

Dr. Kenneth Hall Memorial Psychiatry Prize

Awarded to a student for their clinical performance in third year.

Arthur F. Iceton Memorial Scholarship

Awarded to a student who is competing in the athletic program at the varsity level. May be renewed for a subsequent year should the recipient continue to qualify under the terms.

Dr. Donald S. Robb Memorial Award

Awarded to a student who has completed the third year of study and has demonstrated excellence in patient contact, and satisfactory academic progress. Consideration will also be given to students' community involvement and volunteer activities.

Morris and Sarah Gold Award

Awarded to a student who has contributed to the medical literary field.

Bessie S. Stewart Scholarship

Awarded to a student who intends to become a medical missionary and who in the opinion of the Faculty of Medicine shows the attributes of human concern and academic ability.

Canadian Medical Association 150th Anniversary Scholarship

This award was established in April 2017 by the CMA Foundation to be awarded to one student annually over the five-year period based on comprehensive achievement in all educational domains and a demonstrated ability to exemplify the values of professionalism including integrity responsibility and accountability, and a commitment to self-improvement and collaboration.

These values will be identified in a reference letter included with the application (from a tutor/preceptor/mentor) outlining how the student has demonstrated these personal skills in a classroom, elective, or clinical experience.

Preference is given to students who are CMA members; Canadian Citizens/Permanent Resident; registered full-time undergraduate MD student in good academic standing with the Faculty of Medicine, Dalhousie University.
