



## **Call for Expressions of Interest (Internal) Unit Head Human Development – MED 1**

Undergraduate Medical Education (UGME) is currently seeking expressions of interest for the position of Unit Head for Human Development, Med 1.

This position provides an exciting opportunity for faculty members with an interest in undergraduate medical education, including curriculum design and implementation. Reporting to the Assistant Deans, Preclerkship, the Unit Head oversees, coordinates, and supports the delivery of this Unit. This role includes working with the Human Development Component Heads, and other members within UGME, as well as several faculty and staff members across the Faculty of Medicine to ensure the academic and administrative requirements are met for this academic program.

The anticipated start date is negotiable. This is a three-year, limited-term position requiring a time commitment of approximately 8 hours per week for the duration of the Unit (approximately 8 weeks per year).

Please note the remuneration structure varies based on your workplace:

- DMNB faculty are compensated at an hourly rate based on established teaching rates.
- DMNS faculty are remunerated according to rates determined by their respective department (based on AFP or other arrangements). If you are part of the DMNS faculty, it is recommended that you discuss with your department head to ascertain both the time commitment and the remuneration specifics.
