

Call for Expressions of Interest Longitudinal Theme Head, Biochemistry

Undergraduate Medical Education (UGME) is currently seeking expressions of interest for the position of Longitudinal Theme Head, Biochemistry.

This position provides an exciting opportunity for faculty members with an interest in undergraduate education, communication skills, and providing Medical Students with feedback and coaching. The Longitudinal Theme Head oversees, coordinates, and supports the delivery of sessions relating to biochemistry objectives throughout the 4 years of the UGME curriculum (including lectures, tutorials, and labs). As biochemistry objectives are found in multiple units of the UGME curriculum, the longitudinal theme head will work in close collaboration with the component and unit heads where these sessions are found.

The anticipated start date is negotiable. This is a three-year, limited-term position requiring a time commitment of approximately 8 hours of preparatory work per week averaged over a 26-week period to ensure the success of the Theme. A full job description can be found on the UGME website.

Please note the remuneration structure varies based on your workplace:

- DMNB faculty are compensated at an hourly rate based on established teaching rates.
- DMNS faculty are remunerated according to rates determined by their respective department (based on AFP or other arrangements). If you are part of the DMNS faculty, it is recommended that you discuss with your department head to ascertain both the time commitment and the remuneration specifics.
