



Call for Expressions of Interest Research in Medicine (RIM) Director (2 positions)

Undergraduate Medical Education (UGME) is currently seeking expressions of interest for the position of RIM Director (2 positions in Dalhousie Medical School, Nova Scotia (DMNS)).

This position provides an exciting opportunity for faculty/ physicians/ researchers with an interest in medical research, research development, and providing Medical Students with research experiences. Reporting to the RIM Co-Chairs DMNS (RIM Unit Head) and DMNB, the RIM Director oversees assigned cohorts of undergraduate medical students, with their primary role to advise students as they undertake research projects.

The anticipated start date is negotiable. This is a three-year, limited-term position requiring a time commitment of approximately 4 hours per week averaged over 48 weeks. A full job description can be found on the [UGME website](#).
