



## **Call for Expressions of Interest (Internal, Halifax-based physicians) Ultrasound Component Head**

Undergraduate Medical Education (UGME) is currently seeking expressions of interest for the position of an Ultrasound Component head.

This position provides an exciting opportunity for faculty members with an interest in undergraduate medical education, including curriculum design, assessment and implementation. Reporting to the Assistant Dean Skilled Clinician and Interprofessional Education, the Ultrasound Component Head is responsible for the design, delivery, quality improvement of the Ultrasound objectives that run from Med 1 – Med 4. These responsibilities are supported by the Office of Undergraduate Medical Education (UGME).

The anticipated start date is negotiable. This is a three-year, limited-term position requiring a time commitment of approximately 4 hours per week over approximately 35 weeks per year.
