I am very proud of our successes during the pandemic and wanted to thank you for your important contributions.

Last week, we launched our new strategic plan and unveiled the **DalEM** logo that you see at the beginning of this blog. It is essential that you RSVP and not share the link to avoid rounds being "Zoom Bombed". Rounds are accredited for CFPC Level 1 and RCPSC Section 1 credits. Each site is responsible for submitting the list of attendees to Jennifer Day (JenniferE.Day@nshealth.ca) every 3 months to obtain these certified credits.

In Charlottetown, **Dr. Charles Duffy** has been seconded from his role as ED Site Chief to the Incident Commander of the hospital Emergency Operations Committee. **Dr. Aaron Sibley** is once again stepping in as the Acting Site Chief. **Dr. Trevor Jain** has been appointed a disaster medicine advisor to the provincial Joint Response Team.

Under the guidance of **Dr. Paul Atkinson**, New Brunswick continues to develop a provincial Emergency Medicine group. Currently the group is discussing key quality metrics for the provinces. DalEM rounds as well as NB rounds which occur on the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Tuesday of the month were promoted. In Saint John, the department has established 11 clinical focus groups using MS Teams to raise issues and propose solutions. All staff emergency physicians are participating in at least one group.
