

ADHD

Upon completion of this seminar, the resident should be able to:

- 1. Describe an approach to ADHD diagnosis
- 2. Define ADHD and its subtypes using DSM IV criteria
- 3. List common ADHD symptoms in adults, teenagers and children.
- 4. Formulate appropriate broad based differential diagnosis for conditions that may present as behavioral problems
- 5. Recognize the importance of including multiple sources of information.
- 6. Develop a management plan for ADHD
- 7. Identify and be able to direct the management of common co-morbidities
- 8. Initiate a practical management plan for individual ADHD patients with assessment tools, therapeutic options, follow up and resources
- 9. Construct a personal formulary of appropriate pharmaceutical treatment for ADHD
- 10. Manage common problems associated with ADHD therapies including medication sideeffects, co-morbidities, and age-related issues
- 11. Identify red flags such as treatment failure, drug abuse, alternate diagnoses that should trigger appropriate referral
- 12. Apply principles of chronic disease management to behavioral problems including:
 - a. Self-care
 - b. Team based approach
 - c. Routine and regular follow up for pro- active care
 - d. Information management
 - e. Management of complex medical issues
