

Arthritis: OA/RA/Gout

At the completion of the seminar the resident will be able to:

- 1. Differentiate key historical and physical characteristics of inflammatory versus osteoarthritis.
- 2. Have a clear differential of, and approach to, investigation of inflammatory arthritis including systemic etiologies.
- 3. Outline effective pharmacological and non- pharmacological therapies for both inflammatory and osteoarthritis.
- 4. Be aware of contra-indications to common pharmacological therapies for arthritis.
- 5. Understand the importance of, and approach to, acute mono-articular arthritis and the need to rule out septic joint in appropriate clinical scenarios.
- 6. Describe when diagnostic imaging is indicated, and which modalities are most appropriate to rule in or out specific diagnoses.
