

Diarrhea

At the end of the seminar the residents will be able to:

- 1. Identify potential etiologies in patients presenting with acute diarrhea through detailed history (eg, infectious contacts, travel, antibiotics or medication use, family history of IBD).
- 2. Outline risks for Clostridium difficile infection including hospitalizations and medications.
- 3. Be familiar with red flags that would suggest need for further investigations in a patient presenting with diarrhea.
- 4. Describe a rational laboratory testing of the patient with diarrhea (eg consider duration and possible etiologies when choosing whether or not to investigate).
- 5. Develop an approach to medical management of acute diarrhea including when antibiotics are indicated, and which patients can and cannot safely use intestinal antimotility agents.
- 6. Identify both gasto-intestinal and extra intestinal signs of specific diseases (eg IBD, Malabsorption syndromes, immune-compromise, and malignancy) in patients with chronic or recurring diarrhea.
