Evidence-Based Medicine

The resident shall be skilled in evidence-based approaches to medicine including information management and its application to clinical medicine, self-directed learning and practice management.

The resident will develop an approach to evidence-based skills and apply it to clinical problems in:

- 1. family medicine
- 2. life cycle
- 3. care of children
- 4. care of adolescents
- 5. care of adults
- 6. care of the elderly
- 7. surgical and procedural skills
- 8. behavioural medicine
- 9. emergency care

The resident will use, in the clinical setting, evidence-based health maintenance.

The resident will review an article using evidence-based skills.

The resident will present a seminar on a clinical topic using:

- 1. patient centered principles
- 2. effective audio visuals
- 3. appropriate use of resource persons

The resident will successfully complete a project with a clinical application.

The resident will be able to conduct an office-based clinical audit using the following process:

- 1. Identify at least one practice population-based question
- 2. Access the patient database to review the identified component of care
- 3. Select and assess the evidence from medical literature or other sources to evaluate this component of care
- 4. Incorporate the results of a practice review and establish a method for re-evaluation.
