

Seizures

At the completion of the seminar, the resident will be able to:

- 1. Take a history to distinguish a seizure from other events
- 2. For a patient having a seizure:
- 3. Describe the approach to ensure proper airway control
- 4. Describe drugs to use to promptly to stop the seizure
- 5. Describe reversible metabolic causes of seizures
- 6. Describe the appropriate examination of a patient with a new seizure
- 7. Outline the investigation of a patient with seizures
- 8. Manage a patient with a change in the primary seizure disorder
- Describe the important aspects of ongoing care to a patient with a stable seizure disorder including:
 - a. Compliance,
 - b. Side effects of anticonvulsant medication,
 - c. Assessing the impact of the disorder and its treatment on the patient's life
 - d. Monitoring for complications of the anticonvulsant medication
 - e. Modifying management of other health issues taking into account the anticonvulsant medication
