

# UTI

9. UTI in children--- evidence based choice of sampling, timing and choice of investigation, treatment and referral
10. Awareness of asymptomatic bacteriuria
11. Differentiate relapse and recurrent UTI
12. Evidence based approach to recurrent UTI – risk factors, options of treatment continued prophylaxis, post coital prophylaxis and intermittent self-treatment.
