

DESCRIPTIONS FOR MED 3 ROTATIONS

Respirology A3S

A. Medical Expert

- Develop further knowledge in the broad areas of Respirology; in particular, clinical approach to common outpatient/inpatient problems e.g. COPD, Asthma, pneumonia, obstructive sleep apnea, interstitital lung disease, pleural effusion and pulmonary embolism.
- 2. Observe the diagnostic techniques used in Respirology including bronchoscopy, pulmonary function testing and sleep studies.
- 3. Be able to interpret basic abnormal patterns on spirometry and chest radiography.
- 4. Understand the proper delivery of inhaled medication and be able to teach a patient how to use the medications.

B. Collaborator

- 1. Work effectively with interdisciplinary members of the health care team such as nurses, respiratory therapists, and sleep laboratory technicians.
- 2. As a consultant service, develop an open dialogue with referring services.

C. Communicator

- 1. Contribute to structured teaching at rounds on topics in Respirology.
- 2. Communicate effectively and concisely with patients and their families, Respirology Staff, referring physicians, other members of the health care team and administrative staff.

D. Manager

- 1. Effectively time manage different experiences in Respirology e.g. Pulmonary function lab, sleep lab.
- 2. Effectively time manage in the ward/clinic setting to have a balance between patient interaction, test requisition, dictation or written correspondence and patient follow up.
- 3. Allocate finite health care resources appropriately.

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E. Health Advocate

- 1. Identify patients that would benefit from additional support at home and implement the necessary services.
- 2. Through gathering information on history taking, explore history of smoke/ environmental exposure and direct patient to appropriate programs.

F. Scholar

- 1. Improve ability to interpret peer-reviewed articles and implement the knowledge in clinical practice
- 2. Present peer-reviewed evidence to colleagues and faculty to support diagnosis and management of patient problems.

G. Professional

1. Conduct patient care with confidentially, honesty and regard for ethics of practice.
