A. Overall Goal

The goal of your rheumatology rotation is to learn how to diagnosis and initiate treatment for the following rheumatic diseases:

- Rheumatoid arthritis
- Spondyloarthritis
- Crystalline arthritis
- Connective tissue diseases
- Vasculitis
- Osteoarthritis
- Regional pain disorders
- Fibromyalgia

B. Specific Objectives

- **1.** Formulate differential diagnoses and outline appropriate investigations and management of patients with the following clinical presentations:
 - Polyarthritis
 - Oligoarthritis
 - Monoarthritis
 - Back pain

- 2. Order and interpret appropriately the following investigations:
 - Acute phase reactants (ESR and CRP_
 - Autoantibodies (RF, anti-CCP, ANA, ANCA)
 - Synovial fluid analysis

C. Procedural Skills

- 1. Develop competence in performing a musculoskeletal examination with special attention to assessing joints for evidence of synovitis and deformity.
- 2. Observation of joint aspiration.

- **1.** Actively participate in inpatient care through involvement in the consultation service.
- 2. Attend assigned outpatient clinics.
- **3.** Formal presentation of a patient-related problem demonstrating review of the literature.
