DoM OUTSTANDING TRAINEE AWARD 2023

Description

This award will be given annually to a resident who stands out from their peers in providing the highest quality patient care as part of an integrated interdisciplinary team.

Eligibility

- Department of Medicine specialty or subspecialty resident or fellow.
- Any member is invited to submit a nomination. Self nominations are not eligible.

Criteria

Nominees must demonstrate at least one, or a combination of the following criteria:.

- Excellent communication skills and interdisciplinary collaboration.
- Able to balance and prioritize the many demands while keeping patient care needs at the forefront.
- Excellent teacher as well as a motivated learner.
- Demonstrates an ability to remain calm under pressure and can multitask effectively without being distracted from the important task at hand.
- Knowledgeable and evidence-based with regard to clinical decision making, and yet demonstrate appropriate humility with families and other health care professionals.

Process

Nomination packages must include:

- **One nomination letter**
 - Detail why this individual is deserving of this recognition. Provide specific examples and dates to support the nomination (max 2 pages).
 - Include the name and email address of a second supporting nominator. The committee may reach out to the supporting nominator for further information.
- **Abbreviated current CV** for the nominee.



Selection

The Awards & Recognition Committee will determine the award recipient. The award will be presented at the annual awards event. Nominations will be kept for two years.

Deadline – May 1 annually
