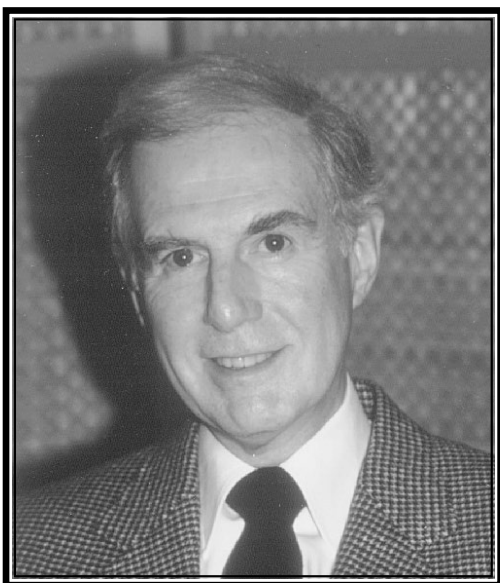

Dr. J.F.L. Woodbury

Dr. Jack Woodbury was born in London, England in 1918, although his family roots in Nova Scotia date back to 1750. He received his M.D., CM degree from Dalhousie University in 1943 and acquired postgraduate training in Internal Medicine at the Halifax Military Hospital while holding the rank of Captain in the Canadian Army (RCAMC). Dr. Woodbury then spent five years in general practice in Halifax before going to Toronto to train in Rheumatology at Toronto General Hospital and Sunnybrook Hospital. He became a Fellow of the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada in 1952.

He was appointed as clinical assistant at the Victoria General Hospital, Halifax in 1945 and joined the Faculty of Dalhousie University as a Lecturer in Medicine in 1950. By 1969, he had become a full Professor in the Faculty of Medicine and was appointed as the

first Director of the Dalhousie University Rheumatic Disease Unit. Over the next 20 years, Dr. Woodbury was a pioneer in the care of patients with rheumatic diseases in Nova Scotia and was largely responsible for establishing Rheumatology as a recognized subspecialty in Eastern Canada. He also became a prominent teacher and researcher in Canadian Rheumatology.

Dr. Woodbury was a past President of the Canadian Rheumatism Association and was the founding President of the Society of Atlantic Rheumatologists. In 1994 he was appointed Professor Emeritus in the Faculty of Medicine, Dalhousie University.

Dr. Woodbury died in 2005, but his legacy of establishing a rheumatic disease unit, now called The Arthritis Centre of Nova Scotia, continues his work of patient centred care and research.

About the Speaker

Dr. Simon Carette is a rheumatologist and Professor of Medicine at the University of Toronto. He trained at Laval University, McGill, the University of Toronto, the National Institutes of Health and the University of Cambridge. He spent the first part of his career at Laval University, where he was Division Head of Rheumatology and later Physician-in-Chief of le Centre Hospitalier de l'Université Laval. He was recruited to Toronto in 1998 to head the Division of Rheumatology at UHN/MSH until 2011, and he was Deputy Physician-in-Chief, Education of UHN/MSH from 2008 to 2017. His area of clinical expertise is vasculitis, and he is the Director of the Vasculitis Program at Sinai Health Network since 2001. He has authored/co-authored 150 peer-reviewed articles and book chapters.
